In presenting this book of Drum Solos for your approval, it is the purpose of the author to endeavor to reach Drummers who wish to advance in their chosen profession and reach as great a degree of perfection as possible. Too little attention is given by a great many drummers to the finer points of the Art. Many of them make no pretense whatever of playing a part as written, they simply look to see if it is 2/4 or 6/8 and then fake their way through, introducing a little ragtime and so manage to pull through a dance all right, but when placed in a concert band or orchestra, or vaudeville performance where legitimate drumming is required they are all at sea and naturally fail to give satisfaction. Books are published containing the Solo Cornet Parts of Standard Overtures and Selections, also Solo Clarinet Parts. This work is intended to fill the same place in Drum Music and the author feels confident it will fill a long felt want. Too great stress cannot be placed on the importance of playing music exactly as it is written, as ignoring the slightest mark may spoil some certain effect intended by the composer and just as much attention is given to writing Drum Parts as is given to any other part in the Band or Orchestra.




When playing No 51 notice. There is a Bass Drum Solo for six measures. The Tempo is the same as is used on Parade about Met. 116. The Small Drum Solo starts with one measure roll. Remember four beats to each measure. This Solo is very important played in Army Style that is with the Flams and Flams Paradiddle also accent the beat in each measure then you will get the proper effect thus. By playing this number over a few times it can be easily mastered.

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

Remember to count four to each measure at about the same tempo as is used when marching. BD Play the flams just as written If you cannot play the flams from hand to hand play them with your left hand and the beat with the right. It must be played with flams to get the proper effect. When starting the roll which appears later and marked thus < start pp and make a gradual crescendo to ff the diminish gradually to pp. This Solo is very important. Notice the different marks and you will have no trouble. If necessary memorize it.

It is a five stroke rough played open Accent the beats very fff at first then gradually diminish. Remember there are 4 counts to each measure. Count as you play. Very simple after you have played it a few times so as to become accustomed to the rhythm.


